THEORY OF ACTION

HS student completes summer SFUSD orientation or credit recovery focused on skill-building.

EARLY COLLEGE

HS student enrolls in college course(s), starting with introductory course and eventually paired with related job or internship.

HS student/graduate is hired for an entry-level job, possibly within the field of study, while completing credit sequence for degree.

Greater work experience and responsibilities lead to a profession in the field and post-secondary degree.

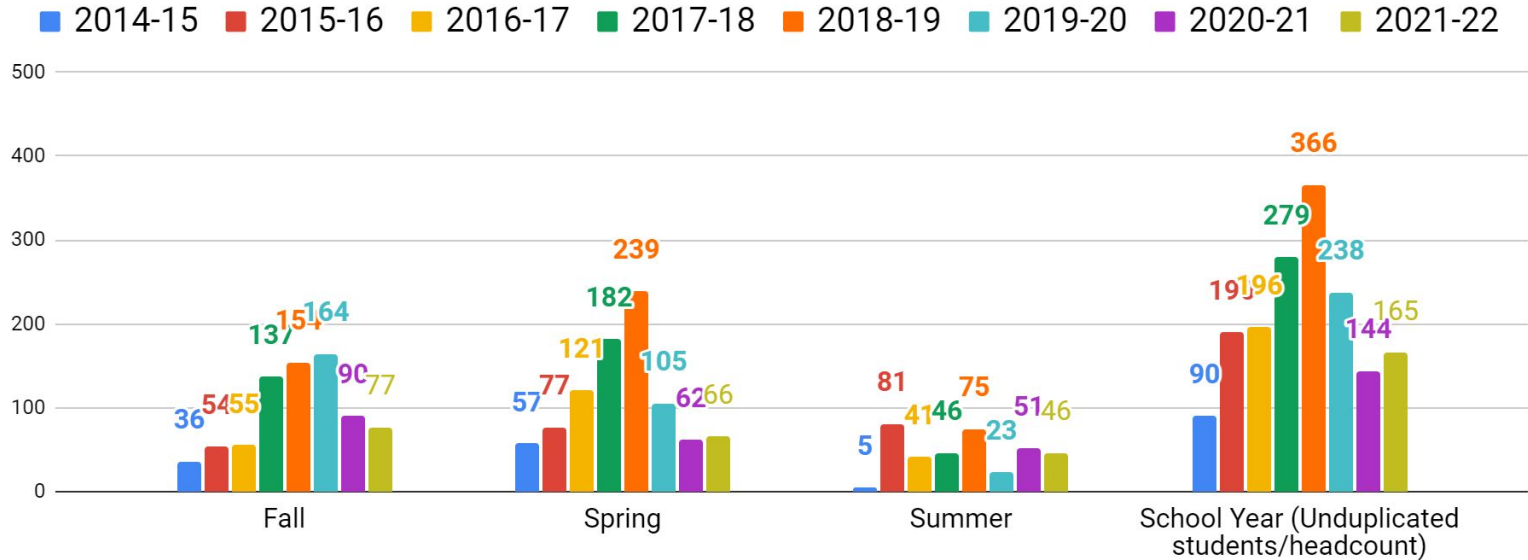
Work experience and related education lead to a higher salary for the graduate.

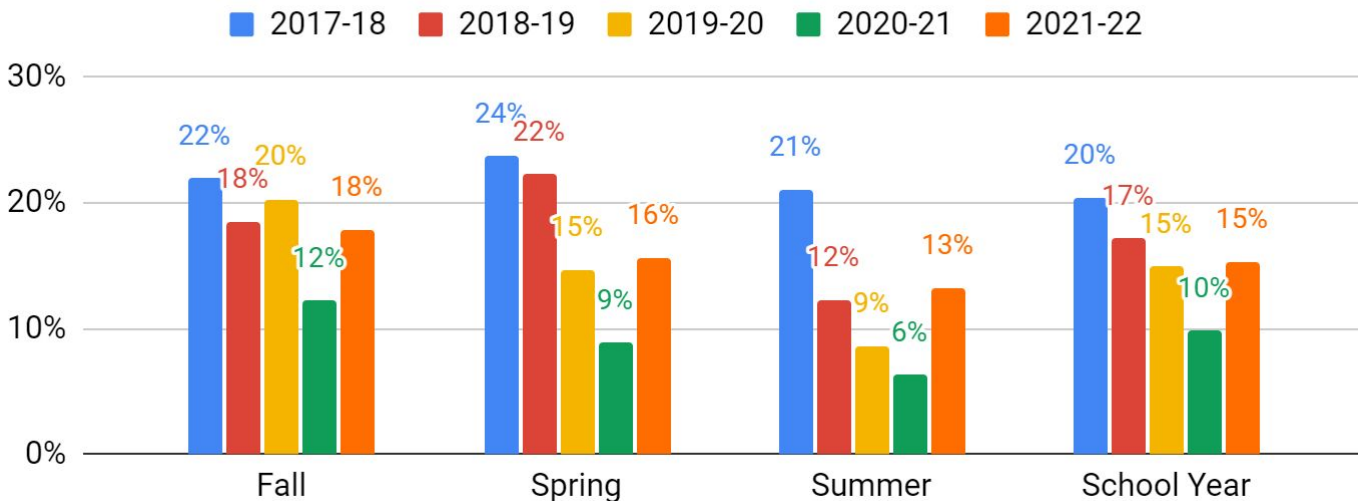
CCSF Dual Enrollment Off-Track Completers by Semester

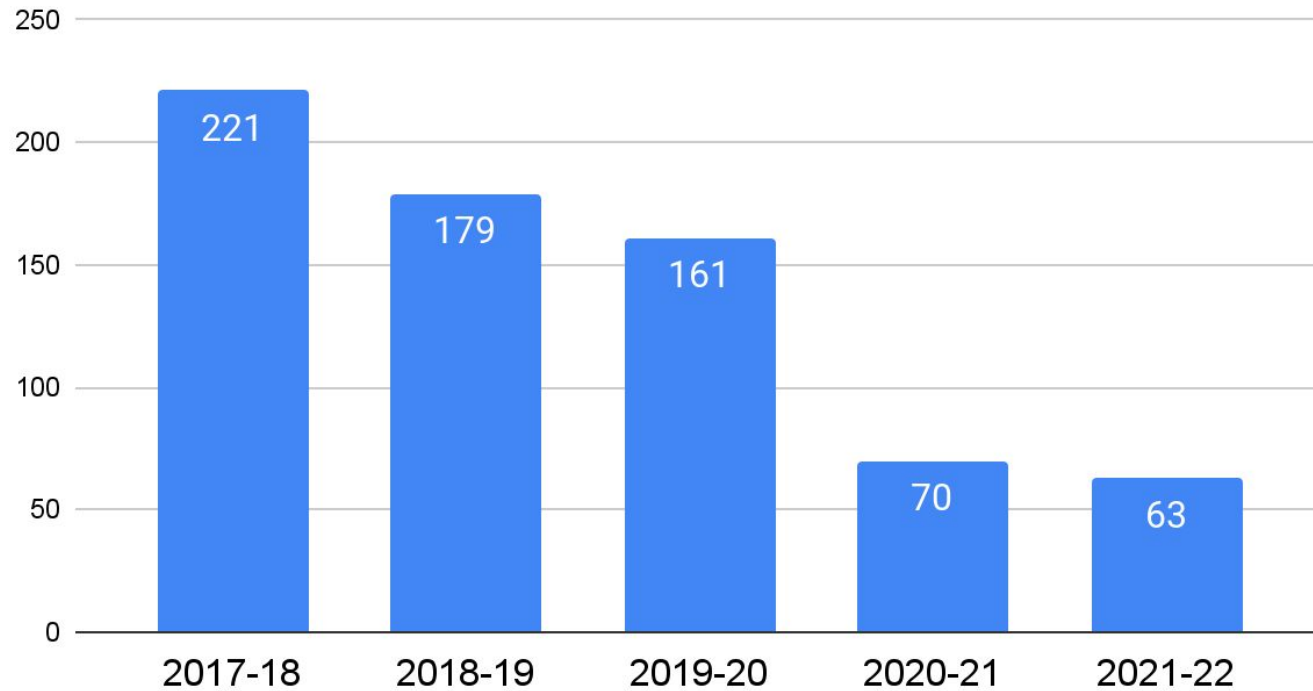

Adult Ed Participants Over Time

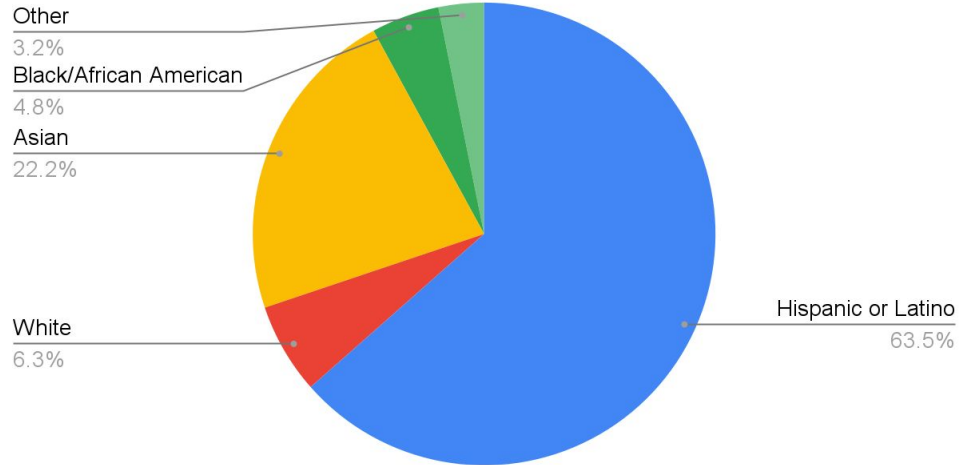

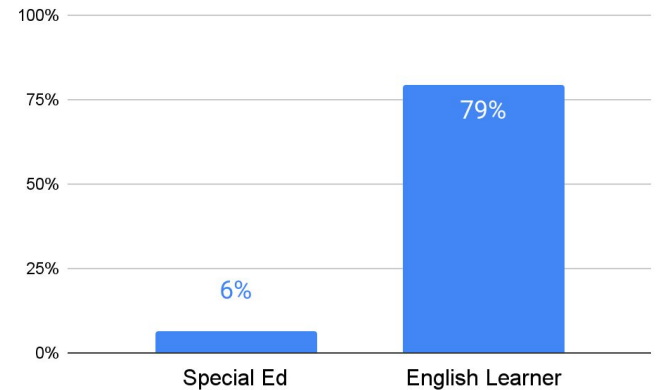
2021-22 Adult Ed Participants By Ethnicity

2021-22 Adult Education Participants by Program

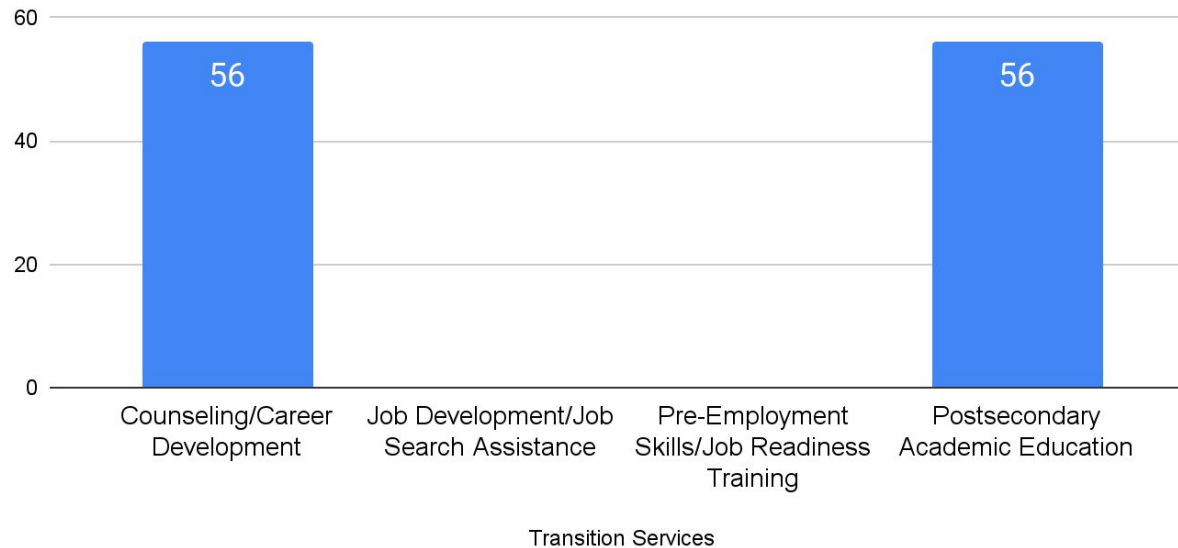

Student Experience

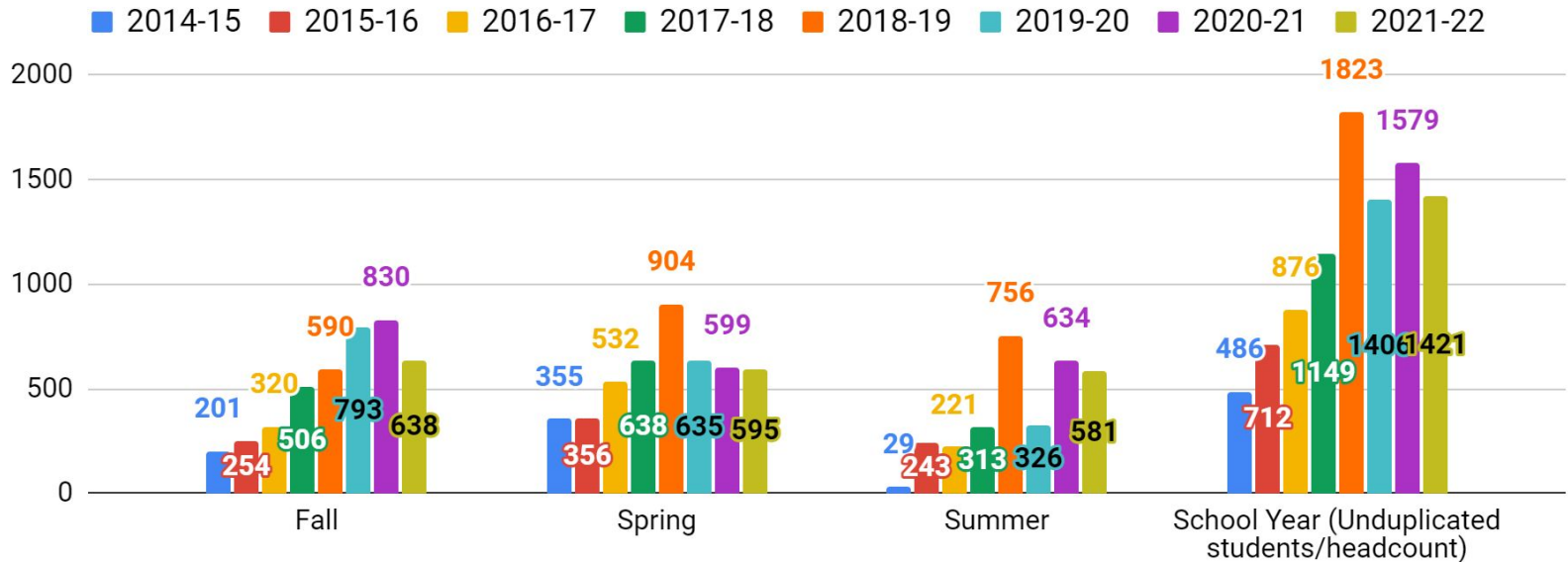
- “I think [Early College] is very helpful because you already **have an idea of how college would look like.**”

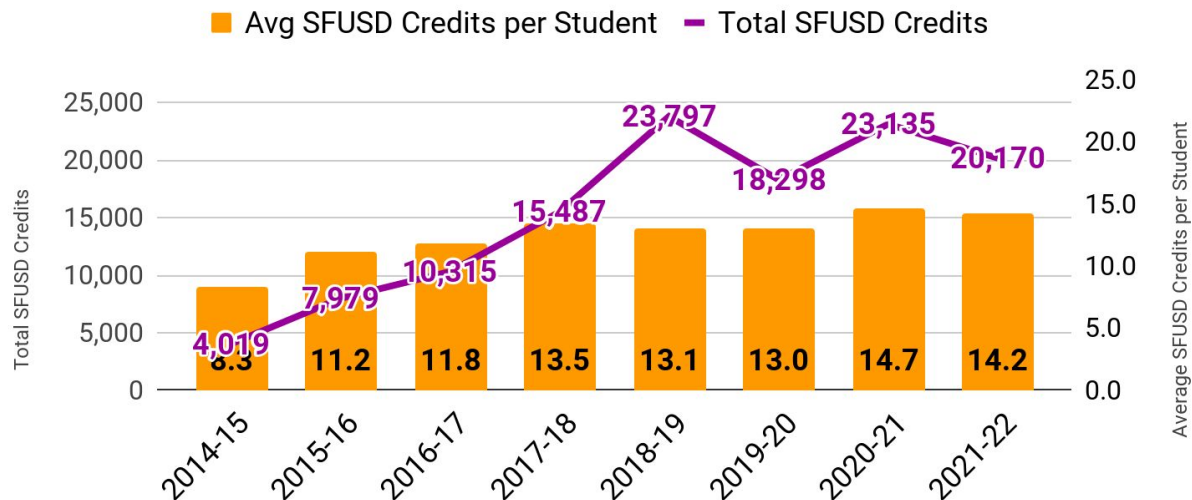
Increasing # of Students Served at CCSF Dual Enrollment
