Public Comment: no written public comment received in advance.

Discussion and Action Items

• Approve minutes of April 2019. Dr. Fong moved, Dr. Coria seconded. Approved.

- Discuss 2020-21 allocations to members and potential changes due to COVID-19 emergency:
 - Preliminary allocation from CAEP in March included a COLA. The CAEP office warned all consortia that the COLA would likely be eliminated, and that allocations may be reduced by up to 12%.
 - The members discussed maintaining current structure of 90% to CCSF, as the primary provider of adult education services in the county, and 10% to SFUSD.
 - There was extensive discussion re the possibilities of future cuts from the State, and how such cuts might reduce SFUSD's allocation to an amount that would limit their ability to be effective. It was agreed, in principle, that should such cuts occur, the consortium would reconsider the 90%-10% split structure, and instead set a minimum dollar amount of funding to SFUSD to ensure their efficacy.
- Approve 2020-2021 allocations to members and Consortium Fiscal Administration Declaration (CFAD). Dr. Fong moved, AVC Charles seconded. Approved unanimously.

Consortium Updates

- Consortium Director, Wendy L. Miller presented a brief overview of CCSF's activities and spending during the 2019-2020 program year. Major activities included support for noncredit instruction (ESL and TRST), SF-IBEST, Chromebook and wifi hotspot loan program, Language Line services, Mission Family Resource Center. Ongoing support for Online Learning and Educational Technology (OLET), Office of Research and Planning (ORP), counseling and DSPS at Centers, and Professional Development.
- Dr. Jen Fong presented data regarding students served with AEP dollars at SFUSD, noting a steady increase since 2015 in numbers of SFUSD students over 18 years old also taking classes at CCSF.

Q&A and Discussion

- The members agreed we should re-convene should there be a largely reduced allocation to AEP in the State's May revise of the budget.
- Discussion re need to work on post-pandemic plan, expand online teaching and learning for noncredit at CCSF, look at future of SF-IBEST during and after the pandemic.

Narrative:

The planned allocations are consistent with the Consortium's annual plan and our three-year plan. City College of San Francisco's noncredit programs provide the majority of Adult Education programs and services in the city, hence 90% of the total funding amount is allocated to the college, and 10% to the school district.

Changes:

The slight changes in the individual allocation amounts reflect the 90% - 10% split of the total allocation to the Consortium and includes a proportional distribution of the roughly 1.49% COLA among the two members. CCSF's allocation is increased by \$54,055, and SFUSD's allocation is increased by \$5,157.

Total preliminary allocation = \$4,006,950

- SFUSD allocation = \$400,695
- CCSF allocation = \$3,606,255
